# Campus Update Workforce Development, Continuing Education & Strategic Partnerships

## December 2021

Dear Campus Community,

We want to highlight some updates regarding our work within the division.

#### **Grants and Awards**

The Division completed a *Community Health Worker Apprenticeship* training program funded by the NYC Small Business Services (SBS) and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for 47 students. Classes were taught by KCC Continuing Education instructors, Dr. Sasha Harry and Ronald Sanchez, MPH. Students received supportive services and job placement assistance through SBS. **Total grant award: \$117,000.** 

Received a grant from the **deLaski Family Foundation** to support the college's microcredentialing initiatives as part of a larger award from the Education Design Lab's Community College Growth Engine Fund (CCGEF) program. The award will pay for the cost of digital badging through Credly and scholarships for students who are enrolled in the CCGEF microcredential program. **Total grant award: \$10,000.** 

Submitted two (2) grants for the CUNY Green Jobs Grant Program:

Proposal 1: In collaboration with LaGuardia Community College and the New York City College of Technology, we submitted a proposal to hire an Offshore Wind Industry Liaison who will convene local offshore wind (OSW) stakeholders to advise OSW program development at CUNY. This advisory board will develop Bridge to Offshore Wind, an interactive and engaging seminar to introduce local residents to the incoming OSW industry, including on-ramps to jobs and career pathways. **Total grant amount: \$349,469.** 

*Proposal 2*: Submitted a proposal for capital funding that will increase the college's capacity to serve local residents who want to be trained for the offshore wind industry. The funding request includes renovations to the T3 building to improve the physical infrastructure, upgrade classroom technology and support increased enrollment. Funds will also go towards upgrading and maintaining the R/V CUNY 1, the college's 65' hybrid electric-diesel catamaran, so it can train residents to work on Crew Transfer Vessels, an integral maritime-related job in the OSW industry. **Total** grant amount: \$2,900,000.

### Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

We also want to make you aware of a great program for first generation college students, America Needs You (ANY). *America Needs You* is a career development and mentoring program where students participate in bi-weekly career workshops that allow Fellows to develop relationships with over 200 highly accomplished Mentor-Coaches and engage with community and business leaders. The three primary components of the curriculum are: *Life Planning, Career Development, and Community Leadership Projects*. Students who participate in this program will receive a \$2,000 stipend. Applications are open now and the deadline to apply is April 15, 2022.

#### **Program Updates**

The long awaited *Business of Music* class kicked off on November 15. Hovain Hylton, Hip Hop Manager and President of the Cinematic Music Group spoke with guests from the music industry on a weekly basis, including Jonny Snipes, founder and CEO of Cinematic Music Group, Rob Markman, hip-hop journalist and Director of Artist Relations at Genius, and Chris Herche, Cinematic's Chief Marketing Officer. Job Corps Scholars continues to help students enroll in and complete training in healthcare, technology and professional services. Three (3) students enrolled in college, one (1) student started their own business, four (4) students entered employment: one (1) student is a new Pharmacy Technician at Walgreens Pharmacy; one (1) student in a Data Analytics Apprenticeship at Google; one (1) student is a Lab Tech at Johnson and Johnson and another student became an EMT at Seniorcare EMS. Currently recruiting 18-24 year old applicants with HS Diploma/GED/HSE. Apply now for Winter and Spring 2022. Space is limited.

The *UX Microcredential* is recruiting for Winter 2022. This free 8-week intensive course provides students with Human Centered Design and Visual Design courses, project based learning, case studies for a digital portfolio and networking opportunities. <u>Apply now</u> - space is limited.

**Design Works** is recruiting for Winter 2022. This 6-month User Experience Design program provides students with Human Centered Design, Visual Design, Coding for Designers, Entrepreneurship and Capstone courses, employment readiness support, paid internship opportunities and project based learning. Apply now - space is limited. From our first cohort, six (6) students found work immediately after completion of the DesignWorks UX Training Program. One (1) alum was hired as a UX/UI Designer at a startup crypto wallet company. Another was hired as a Jr Product Designer at FCB Health. Two (2) found contract work - Visual/Brand Designer (3-month) at Smart Design and Jr Product Designer at Dot Dash (6-month). Yet another alum started his own agency and hired a classmate! Some alumni are expected to embark on new career adventures shortly after completion of their internships.

<u>CUNY Fatherhood Academy</u> is recruiting for College and Career Prep (Winter 2022) and HSE/GED (Spring 2022). Students must be 18-30 year old fathers or expectant fathers. A College and Career Prep (CCP) alumni was recently accepted into a business networking organization and an HSE alumni Rodrigo Rojas is entering his final semester in college where he is pursuing an accounting degree.

**Comp TIA** is recruiting for winter 2022. This free program kicks off in January. Students will be prepared to take the A+ exam, and receive employment readiness services, paid internship opportunities and job placement assistance. Apply now - space is limited.
