Proposed Course Description

Old Art 33: SURVEY OF ART HISTORY: FROM ANCIENT TO RENAISSANCE ART Comprehensive, chronological introduction to the history of art and architecture from ancient civilizations to the Renaissance. Consideration of the cultural context of artistic developments and styles. Required of Art Majors in first year. See Department Advisor.

Flexible Core: World Cultures and Global Issues (Group A)

New Art 33: SURVEY OF ART HISTORY: FROM ANCIENT TO RENAISSANCE ART Comprehensive, chronological introduction to the history of art and architecture from ancient civilizations to the Renaissance. Consideration of the cultural context of artistic developments and styles. Required of Art Majors. **Recommended in first year.** See Department Advisor. Flexible Core: World Cultures and Global Issues (Group A)

Justification: Not necessary that students take this course in the first year.

Old Art 34:SURVEY OF ART HISTORY: FROM RENAISSANCE TO 19TH CENTURY ART

Major movements in Western art from the Renaissance through the late nineteenth century focusing on formal as well as historical issues. New Art 34: SURVEY OF ART HISTORY: FROM RENAISSANCE TO 19TH CENTURY ART

Major movements in Non-Western and Western art from the Renaissance through the late nineteenth century focusing on formal as well as historical issues. Required of Art Majors. Recommended in first year. See Department Advisor.

Justification: More accurately reflects course content.

Old Art 43:DIGITAL ILLUSTRATION

Learn to use the computer as a design tool for creating and manipulating images, combining them with typography and for the creation of a graphic design and portfolio.

New Art 43: DIGITAL ILLUSTRATION
Introduction to the computer program Adobe
Illustrator and its' use as a tool to create and
manipulate illustrations and graphic designs for
the development of portfolio pieces.

Justification: More accurately reflects course content.

Old Art 46:PHOTOSHOP AS A DESIGN TOOL Introduction to the core features and functions of a computer-assisted illustration program. To be used as an image manipulation tool, an image retouching tool, an effects tool, an illustration and paint program, as well as a tool to import and sean images and perform color and tonal changes.

New Art 46:PHOTOSHOP AS A DESIGN TOOL Introduction to core features and functions of this photo-based image editing program. Students will manipulate, re-touch, apply effects, import and scan images, perform color and tonal corrections and use illustration and paint techniques. This design and illustration tool will be used in the development of portfolio work.

Justification: More accurately reflects course content.

Old Art 68:ILLUSTRATION

Basic concepts and skills of illustration including drawing, painting and various media. Acquiring illustration techniques appropriate for the field of visual communication and the development of a portfolio.

New Art 68: ILLUSTRATION

A studio course for the development of basic illustration concepts and skills, including drawing, painting and using various media. Students will develop illustration techniques appropriate to the field of visual communication and the development of a portfolio.

Justification: Original description is poorly written.

Old Art 73:DIGITAL PUBLICATION DESIGN Design for the printed page, such as newspapers, magazines, book jackets, brochures, etc. using the computer program Adobe InDesign.

New Art 73:DIGITAL PUBLICATION DESIGN Introduction to the computer program Adobe InDesign and its' use as a page layout tool for designing print and digital publications including magazines, books, brochures, and more.

Justification: More accurately reflects course content.

Old Art 74:EXPERIMENTAL TYPOGRAPHY A studio course using typography as a design tool with a focus on the creative and aesthetic use of letter forms for visual communication problemsolving.

New Art 74:EXPERIMENTAL TYPOGRAPHY This studio course introduces the fundamentals of typography as a design discipline and its practical applications. Students will learn the principles and terminology of type and how to design with it to communicate effectively.

Justification: More accurately reflects course content

Old Art 75:INTRODUCTION TO GRAPHIC DESIGN AND ADVERTISING

Introductory course on the conceptual aspects of problem solving in graphic skills and advertising. The class will be geared toward creating a professional level portfolio.

New Art 75:INTRODUCTION TO GRAPHIC DESIGN AND ADVERTISING

In this studio course, students will explore an array of graphic design and advertising assignments with an emphasis on concept development and creative visual problem solving and will create professional quality portfolio work.

Justification: More accurately reflects course content.
