#### FROM:

HIS 2000: The Immigrant in American Society

Changing immigration pattern from the 17th century to the present. Immigrants, their motives and ambitions (background, role in American society, and contributions to American life).

#### TO:

HIS 2000: U.S. Immigration History

This course explores the history of migration to the United States. It investigates the experiences of diverse groups of migrants and examines the interactions between migrants and the nation, exploring the changing meanings of "foreign" and "American."
