Re: Proposed New Concentration Learning Outcome: Introduction to Women's, Gender

and Sexuality Studies Concentration

Overview and Rationale:

The most recent review of the Women & Gender Studies Program highlighted a number of concerns that the reviewers discussed under the heading "Coherence, transparency, and accountability" (June 2021). One element of their discussion was the need for an expanded name for the concentration to include Sexuality Studies, which was approved by the Curriculum Committee in the Fall of 2021. Another part of that discussion was the lack of transparency regarding what constituted a WGSS course and what qualify a particular faculty member to teach in the program.

As a first step toward more programmatic coherence, we are proposing a single Concentration Learning Outcome that would be a required element of each course offered through the program. The proposed learning outcome is:

Students will demonstrate their understanding of the social construction of gender through the completion of a designated assignment.¹

This will provide a basis for discussion among interested WGSS faculty members regarding course alignment and assessment in conjunction with the changes in program requirements described in other parts of this submission.

This outcome has been included in the proposed course BEH 2100 and will be part of the planning for all of the related WGSS courses.

In addition, we propose to update the current section of the Concentration that includes a previous version of the Liberal Arts Learning Outcomes, to reflect the more recently approved version.
