The Department of Behavioral Sciences is proposing changes in Course Title, and Prerequisites, Corequisites, and Pre-/Co-requisites for EDC 90A4 – Seminar and Practicum in Teacher Development I

For AS Education Studies: 1st -6th Grade Concentration: EDC 3100, EDC 4200, & EDC 2900, with a minimum grade of C AND Department Permission Required.

For PreK-12th Grade Special Education Concentration: EDC 5100, EDC 3100, & EDC 4200, with a minimum grade of C AND Department Permission Required.

Rationale for Changes:

EDC 90A4 Seminar and Practicum in Teacher Development I was originally conceived as the first in a 2-part practicum sequence. As there are no plans to create a second course, we propose removing the sequential *I* in the title.

We propose removing the corequisite designation between *EDC 90A4: Seminar and Practicum in Teacher Development I* and *EDC 2200: Art Workshop in Education*. The purpose of this change is to allow for more flexibility in students' scheduling. Students in the 1st-6th Grade concentration will be given the option to choose between EDC 2200 and THA 6100 to fulfill their arts education requirement.

Brooklyn College's ECAE department is no longer able to accept EDC 90A4 as transferable for major credits. In collaboration with the ECAE department's chairperson, we discussed the option of modifying our current EDC 90A4 course to align with the outcomes of their special education course more closely. As this was not possible due to the course's position as a capstone for 1st-6th Grade concentration students as well, we decided to create a separate special education capstone fieldwork course specifically for early childhood students. The creation of this course will benefit students in the Birth-2nd Grade concentration, as there are currently no other special education course requirements within the concentration.

As such, EDC 90A4 will no longer be a degree requirement for the Birth-2nd Grade concentration. Rather, students in this concentration will be required to take EDC 92, a newly developed course (see separate submission) that focuses on typical and atypical development in early childhood. Brooklyn College has agreed to accept this course as transferable toward their 3-credit ECAE 3108: Foundations and Pedagogy in Early Childhood Special Education.
