RE: Change in Degree Requirements for the A.S. in Mental Health and Human

Services

The Department of Behavioral Sciences and Human Services is proposing a change in degree requirements for the A.S. in Mental Health and Human Services as follows:.

Rationale for Proposed Changes:

PSY 1100, General Psychology, needs to be included within our program requirements because it is a pre-requisite for two courses, which are already included in our requirements. These two courses are PSY 3200, Human Growth and Development, and PSY3600, Abnormal Psychology. Including PSY 1100 in our requirements means that we have to delete one currently required course in order to make room for PSY 1100 in the 30 credits allowed under requirements for our major.

There are currently three distinct options for students in the Mental Health and Human Services major: General Mental Health and Human Services, the Domestic Violence Counseling Concentration, and the Substance Abuse Counseling Concentration. In review of our current degree structure and the need to include PSY 1100 under the requirements for the major, we are proposing to delete the Substance Abuse Counseling concentration entirely as an option for the degree and absorb the General Mental Health and Human Services and Domestic Violence Concentrations into the overall degree – this would leave the A.S. in Mental Health and Human Services with **no** concentrations.

Summary of Proposed Curriculum Changes in the Mental Health and Human Services Major:

Deletion of Substance Abuse Counseling Concentration

Students in the Substance Abuse Counseling concentration are working toward both an associate degree and the New York State CASAC-T (Credentialed Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counseling Trainee). Students in this concentration are already required to take two courses (SAC2400 and SAC2800), which do not count toward the associate degree, but which are required for the CASAC-T credential. If PSY 1100 were included as a major requirement, then students in this concentration would now be required to take

three courses over and above their degree requirements in order to earn both the degree and the New York State CASAC-T. This seems unfair and untenable. Ending the Substance Abuse Counseling Concentration seems appropriate, especially because students desiring a CASAC-T would still have the option of majoring in Chemical Dependency at Kingsborough.

PSY 1100 as a Degree Requirement

To include PSY 1100 as a degree requirement we are eliminating the requirements of choosing a three-credit course from the following: ANT 3700, ANT 3900, SAC 2000 or PSY or SOC Elective (General Mental Health) or choosing a three-credit course from the following: Any ANT, PSY or SOC elective (Domestic Violence).

Merging of General Mental Health and Domestic Violence Concentrations into Degree

Include MH3500, Introduction to Gerontology under degree requirements for the major.

To preserve the option of focusing on a Domestic Violence population, students would be able to select courses as follows:

MH 3100, Principles of Interview and Group Leadership (General Mental Health) **OR** MH 3700, Introduction to Domestic Violence

MH 3400, Mental Health Practices with Vulnerable Populations (General Mental Health) **OR** MH 3800, Assessment and Intervention with Domestic Violence Survivors

Students who complete MH 3700 and MH 3800 will be enrolled at internships (MH 9801 and MH 9802) that focus on Domestic Violence.

The above changes allow for more flexibility for students particularly in the case of students who discover that they no longer want to work with a domestic violence population or who have limitations on their availability to take a particular course.

Electives:

If students have elective credits available, we are recommending students take SOC 3100, Introduction to Sociology, if they have not taken that course to fulfill Pathways Flexible Core: Individual and Society (Group D), as this course is a requirement at a number of programs our students transfer to.

Sunset Dates:

Based on FALL 2017 data, there are 44 students enrolled in the Substance Abuse Counseling concentration, 35 students enrolled in the Domestic Violence concentration, and 325 students enrolled in the General Mental Health concentration. We expect these numbers to remain consistent for Fall 2018 data. To accommodate the currently enrolled students, we are proposing a Sunset date of FALL 2025 to ensure adequate time to graduate students currently enrolled in all concentrations as we move to restructure our degree program.
