Changes to the A.A.S. in Tourism and Hospitality

The Department of Tourism and Hospitality is proposing the following changes to the A.A.S. in Tourism and Hospitality:

1. Deleting TAH 1800, Case Studies in Tourism and Hospitality from the degree and replacing this course with TAH 1200, Tourism and Hospitality Entrepreneurship.

#### Rationale:

After reviewing our curriculum with our Advisory Board, all members agreed that the skills taught in TAH 1200 were necessary in order to make our students ready for immediate employment. Additionally, we realized that the case study method found in TAH 1800 was being utilized throughout the rest of our courses within the Tourism and Hospitality curriculum, so there is no need for duplication of content

2. Deletion of TAH 6600, Cruise Line Marketing and Sales as an option under the Tourism Concentration.

#### Rationale:

The CLIA Industry certification is no longer feasible and is offered through CLIA directly, online, at a substantial cost to the student, in turn, we can no longer offer this course.

The deletion of TAH 6600 will not have a negative impact on students currently enrolled under the Tourism Concentration. Where students were required to select three out of four courses, students will now take TAH 200, TAH 1500, and TAH 6500 in addition to the required TAH 1700.

3. Deletion of the Sport Management Concentration

#### Rationale:

There is one student enrolled in the Sports Management Concentration. This student will be able to complete the remaining TAH 700, Introduction to Sports Management and TAH 4600, Facilities Planning in Sports, as these courses are cross-listed as RPE 700 and RPE 4600. Students interested in Sports Management will be advised of the available concentration under the A.S. in Physical Education, Recreation, and Recreation Therapy.

#### Sunset Date

We are no longer accepting students into the Sports Management Concentration. In order to accommodate the currently enrolled student we are recommending a sunset date of FALL 2022.
