RE:	Change in Program Learning Outcomes (A.S. Theatre Arts)

The Department of Communications & Performing Arts is proposing a change in Program Learning Outcomes for the A.S. Degree Program in Theatre Arts:

FROM:

- 1. **Techniques, Terminology & Theories**: Students will identify and define significant theatrical techniques, terms and theories that are centerpieces of theatrical performance and production.
- 2. **Theatrical Practice:** Students will differentiate between the various theatrical disciplines and production roles, while applying discipline-specific knowledge and techniques through the creation of theatrical productions.
- 3. **Theatrical Trends:** Students will know the greater theatrical timeline, from the Ancients to the Present, including the evaluation of current aesthetics, expectations, standards and trends within the 21st century theatrical industry.
- 4. **Dramatic Literature:** Students will read, discuss and analyze a varied catalog of plays and musicals, written by a diverse representation of playwrights, including (but not limited to) seminal pieces of the theatrical canon, as well as noteworthy contemporary works of the 21st century.
- 5. **Community Engagement:** Students will assess theatre as a civically-engaged, collaborative artform through co-curricular learning experiences.
- 6. **Diagnostic & Creative Thinking Skills:** Students will employ problem-solving skills and creative thinking skills through engagement in the collaborative theatrical process and the creation of artistic work.
- 7. **Analytical Reading & Writing:** Students will apply analytical skills through the critical reading of dramatic literature, the dissection of theatrical concepts and the critical examination of live theatrical productions.

TO:

1. **Techniques, Terminology & Theories**: Students will identify and define significant theatrical techniques, terms, trends and theories that are centerpieces of dramatic

literature, theatrical performance and production, both today and across the theatrical timeline.

- 2. **Theatrical Practice:** Students will differentiate between the various theatrical disciplines and production roles, while applying discipline-specific knowledge and techniques through the creation of theatrical productions.
- 3. **Civic Engagement:** Students will assess theatre as a civically-engaged, collaborative artform through co-curricular learning experiences that highlight the potential for theatre as a vehicle for social change and community building.
- 4. **Creative Thinking Skills:** Students will combine or synthesize existing concepts in original ways and/or work in an imaginative way displaying a high degree of innovation, divergent thinking, and risk taking in service of the collaborative theatrical process.
- 5. **Analytical Reading & Writing:** Students will apply analytical skills (the process of breaking complex topics or issues into parts to gain a better understanding of them) through the critical reading of dramatic literature, the dissection of theatrical concepts and the critical examination of live theatrical productions.

Rationale for Change:

National assessment standards in theatre arts guide programs to have no more than 5 program learning outcomes, as more than that can be difficult to measure over a period of time. Furthermore, after reviewing the existing program learning outcomes, it was apparent that there was overlap that could be eliminated by consolidating the PLO's down to 5 outcome statements.
