The Department of Communications & Performing Arts is proposing a change in **Title**, **Course Description and Prerequisite** for **JRL 3200**

FROM:

JRL 3200 - Advanced Journalism

Further study of newspaper techniques: advanced research, in-depth coverage, interviews, sidebars, profiles, basic reviews, writing styles, headlines and typefaces, copy reading and proofreading, editorials, freedom of the press, legalities.

Prerequisite: JRL 3100

TO:

JRL 3200 - News Writing

Introductory study of newspaper techniques, research, in-depth coverage, interviews, factchecking, profiles, reviews, editing, opinion-based reporting, freedom of the press, legalities.

Prerequisite: None

Rationale for Change:

This change in title and description better aligns with the course's intent and delivery as well as its purpose as a second foundational course for the Journalism major. Due to non-sequential nature of the redesign of JRL 3100 and 3200, a prerequisite is no longer necessary.
