Protecting NYC from Climate Change

New York City is no stranger to extreme weather, but as climate change continues, we're seeing more intense storms and frequent flooding. Hurricane Ida in 2021 was a wake-up call, claiming 11 lives and showing us how vulnerable we are. As we gear up for the Climate Day of Action on Sunday, August 11th, in Canarsie Park at 3 p.m., it's time for us to take a hard look at what needs to be done to protect our city.

Our current sewer system can't handle the heavy rainfalls we're now facing. In 2023, we experienced five major storms that overwhelmed our infrastructure. While the city plans to invest over \$1 billion a year in improvements, making real changes will take time and effort from everyone.

One way to tackle the issue is by using nature-based solutions like rain gardens and bluebelts, which help absorb rainwater and reduce flooding. These green projects not only manage stormwater but also beautify neighborhoods and improve the environment. However, they need to be combined with upgrades to our existing infrastructure for a comprehensive approach.

As we come together for the Climate

Day of Action, it's important for all of us to play our part. Homeowners can check their properties for flood risks and take steps to minimize damage. Community involvement is key to building a resilient city.

New climate projections reveal that New York City will face hotter and wetter conditions in the coming years. According to the New York City Panel on Climate Change (NPCC), by the 2030s, sea levels could rise by more than one foot, annual rainfall could increase by up to 10% and temperatures might climb by as much as 4.7 degrees. These changes will lead to more frequent flooding and intense storms, posing significant challenges for the city.

The NPCC emphasizes the urgency of preparing for these shifts, highlighting the need for improved infrastructure and community involvement to adapt to climate change's impacts. The city must accelerate efforts to protect vulnerable areas and reduce greenhouse gas emissions to mitigate these effects. As we anticipate these changes, it's crucial for New Yorkers to understand the implications and take action to safeguard the city's future.

Climate change is a challenge we



can't ignore. By working together, we can create a safer, more resilient New York City. Let's use the Climate Day of Action as a starting point for real, meaningful change. Together, we can face whatever the future holds.

A Look Back at Canarsie's History – Part II After Season Dance Given by Volunteer Life Guards - 1932

Editor's Note:

A Canarsie native named Douglas Torborg, now living in Florida, mailed an original program for a dance that took place in Canarsie in 1932, and it is our honor to share this piece of history with our readers. The occasion was the "After Season Dance Given by Volunteer Life Guards of Canarsie Beach," and the event took place on October 1, 1932 at the Arcadia Inn at the Canarsie Shore.

Douglas tells us that his father, Harold, was the Secretary for the dance, and his brother, Albert, was the Crew Commodore. Harold was born in Canarsie and lived there his entire life. He had polio and walked with a cane. Harold was nicknamed "Duck"

because he was such a good swimmer. Duck was the manager of Heinrich's Bar and Restaurant, which was located at 135 Conklin Avenue until 1965.

A special thank you to Douglas Torborg for sharing this fascinating find with us, a 92-year-old pamphlet, which is in surprisingly good condition.

Ira Kluger, co-president of the Canarsie Historical Society, will be sharing historical facts about the advertisers in this pamphlet in a weekly column.

G. R. Marshall: George R. Marshall owned and operated a hardware store at 1449 Rockaway Parkway. Although we don't know precisely when the business was established, newspaper advertisements suggest that the store was in existence by 1924. According to the 1939-1940 NYC Tax Photo Collection, Mr. Marshall also dealt in gasoline and maintained a gasoline pump at the curbside.

The site upon which the store was erected was previously occupied by an ancient blacksmith shop, which had various owners over the course of time, including the partnership of Orion Bogart and Ray Davis, Daniel Henry and S. Ford. Circa 1896, a municipal fire company (Engine 57) was established in Canarsie, at what is now 1517-1519 Rockaway Parkway. The firemen would take their horses to Mr. Henry's shop, which was approximately one and onehalf blocks from the fire company's headquarters, to have them shod.

A newspaper advertisement published in 1963, offering the hardware store's showcases, equipment, etc. for sale, suggests that Mr. Marshall was in the process of liquidating the business at that time. Following the closure of Mr. Marshall's hardware store, the store was occupied by Rothstein's Shoe Store, which opened circa 1966. The owner, Abe Rothstein, who I believe was a holocaust survivor, had a second location at 9520 Avenue L. By 1970, the Rockaway Parkway shoe store had closed, and First National City Bank (later known as Citibank) opened a branch in the storefront. Congressman Frank Brasco's office occupied the second story of the building. The store is currently occupied by Ashley Stewart, a women's clothing store.

Cecere's Pharmacy: Unfortunately, relatively little is known regarding Cecere's Pharmacy. In 1938, the pharmacist, Thomas J. Cecere, acquired a license to sell beer at retail, which, in my opinion, was somewhat unusual for a pharmacist. By 1961, the business was known as the Remsel Pharmacy, and by 1975, it was known as the Remsen Pharmacy, the name under which it still operates.

Man Shot Twice on Stanley Avenue

A man is expected to survive after he was shot twice on an East New York street.

Officers from PSA 2 and the 75th Precinct responded to the shooting in front of 738 Stanley Avenue, between Schenck Avenue and Ashford Street, around 3:10 p.m. on Tuesday, August 6th, where they found a 27-year-old man who reported that he was shot once in his shoulder and once in his abdomen by an unknown individual.

Three shell casings were found at the scene. There is no description of the suspect at this time, police said.

EMS rushed the victim to Brookdale Hospital in serious but stable condition.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

Suspect Arrested in Connection to Violent Stabbing in Precinct's First Homicide of 2024

An arrest was made in the brutal, fatal stabbing

of a Flatlands man.
Police arrested and charged Shakel Maldonado, 24, of Flatlands, with murder and criminal possession of a weapon on Saturday, August 10th, in connection to the stabbing death of Nathaniel Thomas, 45

On Wednesday, August 7th, officers from the 63rd Precinct, Engine Company 323 and EMS paramedics responded to the violent stabbing in progress at the intersection of East 53rd Street and Avenue K. Upon arrival, around 8 a.m., they found the 45-year-old victim suffering from multiple stab wounds to the head and abdomen, police said. Crime scene detectives were seen lifting finger-prints from the grill of a black SUV and removing blood samples from the sidewalk.

The victim was taken to Brookdale Hospital by EMS in critical condition. He succumbed to his injuries at the hospital around 8:20 a.m., according to an NYPD spokesperson.

This is the first homicide of the year within the confines of the 63rd Precinct.

Queens Man Fatally Shot Behind Residential Building in Canarsie

Detectives from the 69th Precinct are searching for a suspect who gunned down a Queens man behind a house in Canarsie.

Officers responded to a 911 call of a male shot in the rear of 538 East 84th Street, between Foster Avenue and Farragut Road, around 9:45 p.m. on Wednesday, August 7th, according to police. They found Chad Lewars, 30, of Jamaica, Queens, suffering from numerous gunshot wounds to the torso.

Lewars was rushed by EMS to Brookdale Hospital in critical condition where he succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead, police said.

No arrests have been made, and an investigation is ongoing.



Reconstruction of Marine Park Oval in its Final Stages

A reconstruction project to overhaul the Marine Park Oval is on target for completion in September 2024.

The project, which started in late June 2023, was done in thirds to maximize public access to the popular walking/biking paths during construction, according to a NYC Parks Department spokesperson.

Fences were erected in July for the third and final section, near the Avenue S parking lot, extending from the pickleball courts to the Carmine Carro Community Center.

Once completed, a new water line for drinking fountains will be installed as well as new trees, new pavers for tree pits, additional seating and upgraded inner and outer walking/biking paths, according to the Parks Department.

The project was made possible by \$10.5 million in funding from the City Council and the Mayor's Office.



Clergy Council Holds Prayer Vigil at Troubled Corner

Praises, singing and prayers could be heard at the corner of Flatlands Avenue and East 81st Street, by Bildersee Playground, where members of the 69th Precinct Clergy Council gathered to pray for peace in Canarsie and an end to senseless gun violence. Monthly prayer vigils are held at troubled corners, and a 14-year-old boy was shot in the foot at the playground on April 21st.

Clergy Council President Rev. Cecil Moonsam started off the vigil by praying for those out to do wickedness. "God can heal you and save you," he said. Speaking out against gun violence, he said, "Young men, your life is important

to God." Inspirational songs of hope, like "How Great is Our God," "What a Mighty God We Serve" and "He's Able" followed. Some passersby joined in the signing, lifting their hands in praise.

Rev. Moonsam said that he was glad to have members of C3 join the Clergy Council at the vigil, stating, "Our goal is for the safety of our community." C3 is the Citywide Clergy Collective, an initiative launched by Mayor Eric Adams' last January, which is committed to preventing gun violence across New York City and comes with \$1.5 million in funding from the NY State Department of Criminal Justice.

Riche acknowledged that the area where the vigil was held is problematic. "We are here today with the Clergy Council to pray for the community to ensure our youth are on the right path," he said, also stating that officers are positioned at the location daily to try to improve things.

Members of the clergy offered up prayers. Dr. Gale Forde prayed for protection for our Nation, elected officials and all those in authority, including the President, while Pastor Williams prayed for our community, including every merchant and resident, calling upon the Lord for unity in our homes and schools.

Chaplain Faith Williams prayed for the peacemakers - NYPD officers that serve Canarsie and the military, and Chaplain Dawn Baxter prayed for the sick and afflicted, not only for physical ailments but for those weak in spirit. Pastor Lloyd Claxton prayed for all the businesses in Canarsie and for the youth to have a mind to work and to do things that are right.



Hiring Fair Gets the Job Done

A hot, sunny day. Long lines going around the block of men, women and even some children waiting their turn. This might sound like a crowd waiting to join a roller coaster or other ride at Six Flags or Coney Island's Luna Park, but the long lines were leading people into their next potential great adventure, a new job.

On Wednesday, July 31st, nearly 400 job seekers walked through the doors of Beraca Baptist Church, at 9602 Flatlands Avenue, where the Beraca Community Development Corporation (BCDC) was hosting a Summer Hiring Fair. The hiring fair was from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., but many prospective candidates started to arrive as early as 8 a.m. to check in.

In partnership with the 69th Precinct's Community Council President Gardy Brazela and Beraca Baptist Church, BCDC's Summer Hiring Fair was intentionally planned to take place on the last day of July, a few days after the start of the 2024 Summer Olympics in Paris. The date was important for two reasons: to draw from the momentum of the Olympic Games and align with Beraca Baptist Church's "Summer of Champions" theme, as well as to provide individuals and families with resources, networks and opportunities for the remainder of the summer that would translate to much-needed jobs before the Back

"The BCDC hiring fair was destined to happen," said Mullery Jean-Pierre, pastor of Beraca Baptist Church and president of BCDC, a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization that serves Brooklyn and beyond.

"Following the successful 69th Precinct Community Council Job Fair in April, which saw numerous individuals benefiting, the demand for such opportunities in our area remained high," Jean-Pierre said. "As a pastor in the community, I often hear the plea, 'Can you help me find a job?' Understanding the pressing need, BCDC had to organize another fair.'

Approximately 20 vendors from local organizations were on hand, ready to engage with applicants for a variety of roles within the NYC Department of Corrections, Primerica, Rising Ground, CABS Health Network, One Brooklyn Health and others. The Church Avenue Merchants Block Association (CAMBA), Canarsie

Developmental and Consultation Center (IDCC) and BCDC representatives were present to introduce job readiness programs and courses to career changers and entrylevel employment seekers looking to strengthen their soft skills and candidacy. Dozens of interviews were scheduled that very day.

"Many job seekers had to wait in line to be processed," Brazela said. "It was a wonderful experience for many of them who have never had a job before."

Shirley Demosthenes-Atkinson, CEO of CABS Health Network, addressed the large crowd, which packed both the main floor and the balcony of the sanctuary turned hiring space, offering motivation and support to those applying for roles ranging from entry-level to executive. Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse stopped by as well, inspiring the attendees with words of encouragement. Narcisse stuck around to listen to the concerns of local

residents, sharing resources and information.

With such a wide range of vendors, the applicants were just as diverse. To accommodate a significant portion of the crowd that did not speak English, translators who spoke French, Spanish and Haitian-Creole were stationed at various points in the building. Yellow slips of paper were placed on the vendors' tables. If a candidate needed a translator that wasn't nearby, they only had to raise their hands holding the yellow slip to flag down assistance.

"I found many people to help me," said Walnise Dorsainvil, an attendee of the hiring fair who was assisted by translators. "One of the jobs is going to call me tomorrow. I have hope," Dorsainvil emphasized.

"The event was a success, establishing partnerships with local vendors who are still actively hiring individuals from our community weeks after the fair concluded," Jean-Pierre said.

Callahan added, "It's incredible to study marine life up close. We're learning that science involves creativity and problem-solving to protect our environment from pollution."

Known for its enriching curriculum and hands-on learning, the YESSS program continues to empower students with knowledge and passion for marine STEM fields. As the summer unfolds, KCC remains committed to nurturing young minds and fostering a deeper understanding of our marine ecosystems.

Many donned their baseball uniforms and jerseys, proudly displaying Gooden's legendary Mets number 16, where his incredible pitching

skills and his number 16 jersey made history and was retired earlier this year.


Gooden was in great spirits, engaging warmly with each fan, taking time to chat, reminisce about the old days and share his love for baseball. His generosity shone as he signed autographs, posed for pictures and even embraced the youngest of fans, who weren't even born during the Mets in their prime. For older fans, meeting their childhood hero brought tears of nostalgia, with one gentleman introducing his young son to Gooden while trying to hold back his emotions.

Among the attendees were young baseball athletes, eager to learn from the legend. Gooden took the time to demonstrate his signature pitching style, showing them how to throw a curveball, offering invaluable advice to the next generation of players. Jayden Caro, a pitcher for Kingsborough Community College Wave, received real-life pitching advice from the legend himself.

The Bravo family, including 6-year-old Antony, who is a big Mets fan, were thrilled to meet Gooden, having grown up admiring the 1986 Mets team. Jayden Levin, a 10-year-old super Mets fan, was meeting Gooden for the second time. His father, Jared Levin, recalled his own magical memories of the 1986 Mets, making this event a special moment for their family.

Christian Stanton, a 9-year-old fan, quizzed on Mets trivia, proudly knew that the team won the World Series in 1986. Gooden signed his bobblehead, adding to his collection of cherished memorabilia. Even the pub's mascot, Mikey the dog, a chill and adorable Havanese, was a fan among the crowd.

Dwight Gooden, affectionately known as "Doc," is one of the most celebrated pitchers in MLB history, making his mark with the New York Mets and famously helping the team win the extraordinary 1986 World Series. Gooden's career highlights include being named the National League Rookie of the Year in 1984, winning the Cy Young Award in 1985 and being a four-time All-Star. His best game was on September 7, 1984, when he struck out 16 batters in a completegame victory. Despite personal struggles, Gooden made

a remarkable comeback, later playing for the New York Yankees and contributing to their World Series victories in 1996 and 2000.

The 1986 Mets, often referred to as the "Amazin' Mets," posted 108 wins, the most in franchise history. They defeated the Houston Astros in the National League Championship Series (NLCS) and went on to win the World Series against the Boston Red Sox in a dramatic Game 6. The team's roster included other legends like Darryl Strawberry, Keith Hernandez and Gary Carter.

The meet and greet also celebrated the retirement of Gooden's Mets jersey number 16 earlier this season. Fans enjoyed a unique opportunity to get up close with Doc, receiving an autographed 8x10 picture and an additional autograph on an item they brought with them.


As he signed various memorabilia, Gooden shared a humorous anecdote about the weirdest thing he had ever signed: a toothbrush.

The Bull's Eye Pub has a rich history. It was located on Quentin Road for 13 years before moving to its cur-

rent home on Flatbush Avenue, where it has been for nearly six years.

In an exclusive sit-down with the *Canarsie Courier*, Gooden shared his favorite memory from the peak of his career: "When we went on to win the pennant in 1986 (prior to winning the World Series), after getting so close in 1985, winning at home against the Cubs [in 1984, a major highlight of the Mets season], and the fans rushing the field, was the best moment." Fans who witnessed these classic moments at Shea Stadium and on television agreed, celebrating a golden era of baseball history and the incredible legacy of Dwight "Doc" Gooden.







A Childhood Dream Comes True: Local Performing Arts Program Soars to New Heights!

In 2022, Bay Ridge resident Jill Hudson achieved her lifelong dream: opening her very own performing arts school for children and teens, right here in Bay

She started directing shows with kids in her backyard when she was just 7 years old. "Normal kids had friends over to play," Hudson said. "I had friends over to REHEARSE. It was a very serious passion from a young age."

After hundreds of backyard performances for family and neighbors, Hudson continued her studies in the performing arts, earning her BA in Theatre and English Literature from Roger Williams University in Bristol, Rhode Island in 2004 and going on to earn her Masters degree in Theatre just two years later. During her time in undergrad, Hudson began teaching acting classes at a local arts magnet school not far from her alma mater. She continued teaching throughout undergrad and grad school and beyond.

Over the course of 21 years, Hudson taught and directed tens of thousands of students from all over the United States and around the world, and directed hundreds of shows for dozens of theatre companies, schools, camps and arts enrichment programs all over the U.S., from New York to Los Angeles and from Boston to Honolulu.

Starting in 2009, Hudson was the Director of Theatre for the Middle Division at Poly Prep's Dyker Heights campus for 13 years. Many of her former students have gone on to careers on Broadway, on television, and in major motion pictures, and her work has been featured in Backstage Magazine, Time Out, Playbill, The New York Times, The Boston Globe, The Los Angeles Times, Appleseed Magazine and more, as well as on NYI News, The Parenting Report with Shelley Goldberg, Hawai'i Sunrise Now, Hawai'i Public Radio and much more. And while Hudson enjoyed every moment of this robust career, still, she yearned to take things a step further by venturing out on her own. "Every year, my husband and I would discuss it," Hudson said. "Is it the right time? Is it not the right time? And ultimately, we always wound up deciding to wait. Then 2022 rolled around, and I turned 40. And I realized, if I don't do it now, I never ever will. So I decided to take the plunge."

And take the plunge she did! In April 2022, Triple Promise Academy for the Performing Arts opened its doors for the first time.

"The immense growth has been surreal," Hudson said. "What started out as a once-perweek improv class with 11 kids has now blossomed into a fully-functioning company, with 130 students across eight different programs at two separate locations: Bay Ridge and Staten Island." But Bay Ridge will always be Triple Promise's home. After subletting rooms from local dance studios for the first two years, Triple Promise landed its own commercial space this past July. The new studio, located at 155 Bay Ridge Avenue, has a full dance studio, an office, a kitchenette and a music room, as well as "The Triple Promise Clubhouse," a safe and fun space for kids to go after school, to do their homework, have a snack and to hang out with friends from the time school gets out until performing arts

To date, Triple Promise has produced 16 mainstage shows featuring over 100 children and teens from Bay Ridge and the surrounding areas. Their most recent production, Alice in Wonderland, Jr., was a huge hit. This past spring, they staged an original adaptation of Tomboy, based on the 2011 film by Celine Sciamma, about a gender nonconforming child growing up in the 90's. "We create real art, and we're so proud of our students," Hudson stated.

Hudson runs the company with her husband and business partner, Nicholas Hudson. She also brings in teaching artists who are experts in dance, vocal music and other areas of the performing arts. Hudson is also proud to share that many of her staff are her former students. "I love hiring my former students," she said. "No interview, orientation or training needed. I just throw them into the mess and they automatically know exactly what to do! My former students are the best, and it is such a surreal feeling to see these young


