## ● HOW CAN I BECOME WAC CERTIFIED?

### **Complete a training course: on-campus (A) or on-line (B)**

*Redesign a course syllabus and assignments; revisit your course learning goals; consider how to better define the reading and writing components.*

### **Pilot your revised course in the Spring**

*Work with a CUNY Writing Fellow. Try out your new course syllabus.*

### **Submit a final certification course portfolio**

*Revise your work and write about it. Submit by commencement. Receive payment for 3 hrs.*

## ● HOW DO I GET STARTED?

CHOOSE ONE OPTION THAT WORKS BEST FOR YOU:

### **Option A: On-campus workshop series.**

*For those who like to interact with faculty from other disciplines...*

9 sessions. Read, write, talk. Then continue the conversation on Blackboard.

Mondays and Thursdays, 1:00– 3:30 pm: January 5, 9, 12, 19, 23, 26, 30 and February 2, 6.

You must be able to attend all 9 sessions and be scheduled to teach the revised course during the Spring semester. Submit your provisional course portfolio by February 16th.

### **Option B: On-line tutorial: self study from mid December to mid February.**

*For those who are self starters and Blackboard savvy...*

9 on-line modules of reading/writing assignments + Blackboard Discussion Board Forum.

Work from home to consider how to rework your course.

Write in response to readings and revise a course syllabus.

Print out your work and hand it in with a course portfolio by February 16th.

Teach your revised course in the Spring.

### **Option C: Independent submission.**

*For those who have a strong background in the teaching of writing and are already teaching their discipline on a writing intensive basis...*

Apply. Submit a course portfolio according to WAC’s writing intensive guidelines.

No compensation. Get certified.
