Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

The Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning celebrated Career

Development Month with a variety of activities, including two workshops hosted by CUNY

Tech Prep (Types of Technical Roles and Tech Resumes), information sessions with White

Glove Community Care and Shivoo, and workshops on resume writing, public speaking, internships, and LinkedIn. The Center also partnered with Transfer Manager, Juliana

Dorcelus to host the Career Pathways Through Education panel with guest speakers in the media field. Panelists included Professors John Acosta and Frank Percaccio, Hannah Kliger (CBS News Reporter), Jim Rosario (KCC Alum & Film/TV Production Professional), and a Hunter College admissions representative.

Sixteen (16) students participated in Junior Achievement's Teach for a Day and worked with 4th-grade students to teach lessons on financial literacy at a local elementary school. Students were able to network with their peers and improve their public speaking and communication skills as a part of this service project. This semester included volunteers from National Grid which had the most volunteers for an event post-COVID. Many thanks to Frances Samuel, Service Learning Advisor, for coordinating. Lastly, the Center hosted a very informative virtual career panel with Bank of America. Program and Partnership Updates

Recently, the **NYC Regional Adult Education Network** (**RAEN**)

and New York State Education Department (NYSED) conducted a comprehensive audit of KCC's Strides to Continuing Success ESL/Food Handlers Program, reviewing program materials and visiting ESL and kitchen lab sessions. The Food Handlers program is a unique and highly-rated contextualized ESL training program, which provides intermediate-advanced level English Language Learners the opportunity to develop their English language proficiency while simultaneously learning kitchen skills and preparing for certification in two nationally recognized food services industry credentials. Graduates of the 14-week program may apply a transfer of up to seven (7) credits upon matriculating to KCC's A.A.S. Culinary Arts or A.A.S Tourism and Hospitality programs. The state auditors were impressed by the students' enthusiasm and engagement and were very complimentary about the lunch that the students prepared for them to enjoy. They were also impressed by the alignment to required standards and requirements...but returned for seconds of the pumpkin pie! An extremely successful audit.
