Dear Campus Community,

Please find below some updates and highlights regarding our work within the division for July 2025.

## **Grant Proposals and Awards**

This month we submitted 3 proposals:

\$6.25 million to the US Department of Health and Human Services for a program called Fathers in Focus: Jobs, Fathers, Futures. The program will help fathers develop nurturing father-child bonds, empower fathers to build strong and healthy relationships, support their child's development, and teach skills fathers need to find and sustain gainful employment. This program will build on our CUNY Fatherhood Academy and Job Corps Scholars programs.

\$10,000 to the Finish Line - Louder Than Words grant program will provide CUNY Fatherhood students and alumni scholarships to enroll in a Continuing Education vocational class of their choice.

\$155,000 to the Ira DeCamp Foundation for a program that will provide low-income students with scholarships for our Doula training program. This program will also fund an employment specialist who will connect current students and recent alumni to local organizations that provide mentorship opportunities and will place new doulas with pregnant people and their families.

# **Workforce Trainings**

The first Postpartum Doula training launched on July 7th and completed on July 28th. Fortytwo (42) students completed the training, earning a joint CUNY and "Anew Doula" Certificate of Completion. Students learned to support families as they navigate the early stages of parenthood, ensuring they feel informed, supported, and confident in their new roles.

From Cannabis to Cuisine officially completed its final cohorts in June 2025. Over the past three years, the program far exceeded its original grant targets by enrolling 306 students, with 245 fully attending and 192 earning their Certificate in Culinary Cannabis and Edibles. We celebrated the Winter and Spring 2025 cohorts with a fantastic in-person meal hosted by celebrity chef Miguel Trinidad at his restaurant Marie's. We wrapped up the program with a Zoom celebration, open to all alumni, featuring an infused sorbet demo with Chef Kokujin (aka Instructor Rhiana Hernandez) and a presentation on Processor's Licenses with the Office of Cannabis Management. The non-credit to credit welding program will start on August 26th. This free 15-week-long training will utilize the American Welding Society Fundamentals of Welding curriculum and the Maritime department's welding program. As a result, students will learn stick (SMAW), MIG (GMAW), and TIG (TMAW) welding techniques, which will prepare them to take and pass the American Welding Society's 3G Welders Certification and provide them with college credits upon completion of the program. This training program will also provide a variety of supportive and wrap-around services, including free PPE, safety equipment, welding equipment, and Metro cards to the students. The second ConEd sponsored Weatherization & Clean Energy academy training will start on August 26th. This training program will be six weeks long and focus on Weatherization, Clean Energy, and Core Construction with certifications, stipends, metro cards, and other supportive

The Seafarers International Union (SIU) Pre-Apprenticeship program is accepting applicants. We will provide a stipend/scholarship to participants for the cost of obtaining their Transportation Workers Identification Credential (TWIC), Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC), travel to Piney Point, Maryland for training, uniform, and much, much more! Once accepted into the SIU apprenticeship program, classes, meals, and lodging are free while students are training at the SIU training facility in Piney Point. Graduates are also guaranteed SIU Union membership upon graduation as well as their first job aboard one of the SIU's contracted vessels, earning \$5,000-\$6,000 a month once they start their first assignment! This training and credentialing pathways program is ideal for those seeking a career in maritime that can eventually lead to jobs within Offshore Wind. This is made possible in partnership with Seafarers International Union (S.I.U.), the largest North American union representing merchant mariners. Applications are ongoing, and start dates are filled as the requirements to participate in this program have been met.
