Dear Campus Community,

Please find below some updates and highlights regarding our work within the division for September 2025.

Grant Proposals and Awards

Two proposals submitted to the **CUNY Workforce Development Initiative** grant program:

- Noncredit Certificate for Licensed Practical Nurse program, \$500,000 proposal. If awarded, the funds will be used to develop a new non-credit LPN curriculum, support the application to the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, and pilot the training for one cohort of students.
- Maritime Diesel Technician Training, \$375,000 proposal. If awarded, this program will develop a comprehensive diesel technician training program in partnership with KCC's Maritime Technology AAS program and Hornblower. This program will embed industry-recognized Snap-On certifications into the existing curriculum. A central component of this program is a partnership with Hornblower, the official operator of the NYC Ferry, which will provide job services and employment opportunities to graduates.

We also submitted a \$925,000 proposal to the NYC Economic Development Corporation for a new HVAC Training Program, which would fund the creation of a state-of-the-art training lab on campus. HVAC remains a highly sought-after skill set that opens doors to lucrative entry-and advanced-level construction and maintenance careers. This new training center will enable KCC to offer grant- and contract-funded as well as tuition-based training programs, helping New Yorkers access pathways to gainful careers.

Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

KCC students have an opportunity to explore their future careers during CUNY Career Discovery Week: Connect with NYC's Top Employers, happening November 3–7, 2025. Organized by the New York Jobs CEO Council in partnership with CUNY and Borough of Manhattan Community College, this event is tailored especially for first- and second-year students at both two- and four-year colleges. Throughout the week, participants will join employer-hosted events across New York City, gaining insider access to some of the world's leading companies—including Google, JPMorgan Chase, Citi, and more.

- Explore career paths in tech, finance, professional services, healthcare, and more
- Start building their professional network and career confidence

Workforce Trainings

The Aging Mastery Program, managed by Susan Lavin, received \$10,000 from District 32 Council Member Joann Ariola and \$5,000 from District 47 Council Member Justin Brannan to continue offering the program. This free, 10-class program is in collaboration with the National Council on Aging, based on a curriculum designed specifically for participants aged 50 and older. It focuses on developing skills necessary for measurable improvements in managing health, maintaining economic security, and actively contributing to society. The Fall 2025 semester is now enrolling students, with classes beginning on October 14th. Classes will meet via Zoom on Tuesdays from October 14-December 9, from 3:30pm to 5:00pm. CUNY Office of Health and Human Services provided funding for Human and Health Services students to enroll in the Maternal Health and DONA Birth Doula training. The training started on September 29th, and students who complete it will receive a CUNY Certificate of Completion in Maternal Health, as well as DONA Certificates of Completion in "Introduction to Childbirth for Doulas," "Lactation Support Education," and "DONA International Birth Doula Training." In collaboration with NYU Langone, we have partnered to provide a Community Health Worker training to 22 students. Students will participate in courses such as Introduction to Community Health Service, Critical Issues in Community Health, Concepts of Wellness, and Community Health Interventions. They will earn CUNY certificates of completion and up to 12 credits upon enrolling at KCC. This is the sixth cohort of CHW training, and a concurrent CHW Upskilling program is preparing the fourth cohort of CHWs for career advancement in the field. We sincerely thank our colleagues in the Community Health Department and Professors Gloria Moore, Claudy Damus, Yolanda Blue, Sasha Harry, and Brandy Barber for their dedicated efforts in the program. We also want to recognize Professor Nancy Nemorin, whose support of students, faculty, and administrators has been instrumental in advancing this project.

The division launched a new website featuring the Excelsior Generation: Pathways to Offshore Wind Careers program for High Schools, as well as KCC's Renewable Energy and Sustainable Technology training programs and the training programs offered by other CUNY OWAN schools. ESL/HSE/SNAP Venture & CLIP Program

The Fall 2025 cohort of the long-standing and successful **Strides to Continuing Success ESL/Food Handlers Certificate Training Program** started classes this month. The STS Food Handlers Program offers intermediate to high-level non-native English speakers a unique, free opportunity to enhance their English skills while learning various kitchen techniques. Participants prepare to earn two vital industry-recognized credentials: the National Restaurant Association ServSafe certification and the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene Food Handlers certification. Students who complete this intensive 14-week program can also transfer seven credits to a Culinary Arts program within the Department of Tourism and Hospitality at KCC.

Following the ongoing success of Kingsborough's ESL/Food Handlers Program, the administrative staff was invited by the NYC Regional Adult Education Network (RAEN) to give a Best Practices presentation on managing Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) programs to other NYC-based programs. The conference was highly productive, and the discussion on the best practices of the KCC Food Handlers Program received very positive feedback from program administrators, RAEN, and NYSED officials.
