



Minutes from the Meeting of
The Strategic Planning Committee of College Council

October 20, 2022

Chair Daniel Kane called the meeting to order at 3:05 pm. He began by welcoming Dominic Wetzel as a new committee member replacing Ben Stewart. He asked if anyone was interested in being Committee Secretary. Dominic Wetzel offered and was unanimously approved.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Governance Review Recommendations Report and its impact on the Strategic Planning Committee. The Chair asked members for input on whether they felt the Committee should be involved in this. Judith Cohen suggested no, given that an Ad-hoc Governance Committee has already been established by the President to implement the recommendations, which she is a part of. Other members suggested yes, given that one of the five emphases of the Strategic Plan (2021-2025) the Committee spent many hours working on last year was Governance and Planning. The Committee then discussed ways to try to monitor the progress of the Ad-hoc Governance Committee as it discusses implementation. The importance of the Strategic Plan for the upcoming Middle States review was also discussed.

Questions were raised as to how the Governance Review Recommendations would be implemented. Dominic Wetzel, as a new member, pointed out that many people in the KBCC community are confused about how College Council works. He asked, for example, how the

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Strategic Plan was produced. This led to a discussion about the work and widespread community input, including the faculty and staff survey, that went into producing the document. It was decided that a good use of the Committee's allotted time at the next College Council meeting would be to give a 5 minute explanatory history about how the Strategic Planning document was produced. This would help keep the public informed and help with the effort to be as transparent as possible.

It was agreed that the need to meet as a Committee would increase once the Ad-hoc Governance Committee begins to flesh out the implementation and approval process for the Recommendations, presumably by the Spring. If needed, a meeting could also happen in December.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 pm.
