WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

Stationary Engineers (CUNY), under general supervision, are responsible for the operation, maintenance, adjustment, testing and repair of steam power plant, air conditioning, chiller plant, fire protection systems, electro-mechanical building equipment and related auxiliary systems in public buildings. They operate, maintain, repair and adjust manual and automatic gas and oil fired boilers, furnaces, steam reducing stations, engines, turbines, pumps, valves, heat exchangers, generators, motors, water treatment systems, cooling towers, condensers, evaporators, emergency generators and associated equipment for heating, ventilating, air conditioning, and lighting in public buildings; perform periodic inspections of equipment and repairs of such equipment; schedule, perform and may oversee preventive maintenance; direct the work of oilers, high pressure plant tenders and other subordinate personnel assigned to HVAC plant operation; take responsible charge of a watch and while so engaged supervise and direct subordinate personnel; address emergency repairs as required; operate control consoles in control rooms for building maintenance and building automation systems; adjust HVAC systems water chemistry through testing, treatment, retesting and recording of readings; prepare requisitions for materials and spare parts in accordance with College procedures; orient, train, and monitor subordinates and other personnel on plant operations and job related safety; read meters, gauges, and other recording devices and log the data; prepare and maintain records and write reports of both a technical and an informational nature regarding HVAC maintenance and repair. All Stationary Engineers (CUNY) perform related work.

Special Working Conditions:

Stationary Engineers (CUNY) may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

Some of the physical activities performed by Stationary Engineers (CUNY) and environmental conditions experienced are: working in confined areas in a physical plant, including the boiler room, heating and ventilating room; walking up and down stairs; climbing up and down ladders; handling chemicals; and being around hazardous materials, such as asbestos and infectious waste.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$73.90 per hour, for a 40-hour work week. This rate is subject to change.

ELIGIBILITY TO TAKE EXAMINATION:

This examination is open to each employee of the City University of New York who on the last day of the application period (August 26, 2025):

(1) holds a permanent (not provisional) competitive appointment or appears on a Preferred List (see Note, below) for the title of High Pressure Plant Tender (CUNY) or Oiler (CUNY); **and** (2) is not otherwise ineligible.

(Note: A "Preferred List" is a civil service list which is only for certain former permanent employees of the eligible title who have rehiring rights.)

This examination is also open to employees who were appointed to an eligible title pursuant to New York State Civil Service Law, section 55-a, and who meet all other eligibility requirements.

If you do not know if you are eligible, check with **your college's personnel office**. You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the eligibility requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are marked "Not Eligible," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

ELIGIBILITY TO BE PROMOTED:

In order to be eligible for promotion, you must have completed your probationary period in the eligible title as indicated in the above "Eligibility To Take Examination" section, and you must be permanently employed in the eligible title or your name must appear on a Preferred List for the eligible title at the time of promotion. Additionally, you must have served permanently in the eligible title for at least one year.

REQUIREMENT(S) TO BE PROMOTED:

your "Application for Examination."

License/Certificate Requirements: By the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025) you must possess:

- 1. A valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Department of Buildings; **and**
- 2. A valid Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating System Operating Engineer (Q-01/Q-99) issued by the New York City Fire Department; **and**
- 3. A valid Universal Section 608 Technician Certification issued by a certifying organization approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

These licenses/certificates must be maintained for the duration of your employment. If promoted with a Q99, you must obtain a Q-01 within 90 days from the date of promotion.

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant licenses and certificates on your Profile page and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys) by the end of the Application Period (August 26, 2025).

HOW TO APPLY:

If you believe you are eligible to take this examination, apply using the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application, payment, and completing any required information. A unique and valid email address is required to apply online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, and Mail.com offer free email addresses. All new OASys accounts require verification before a candidate can apply to ensure the accuracy of candidate information. Verification is instantaneous for most accounts and you will receive a confirmation email with instructions to activate your account. For any account creation issues, you will receive onscreen prompts to contact DCAS. This review may require up to two (2) business days to be reviewed and resolved. Please keep this information and the application period deadline in mind when creating your account.

The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. If you are receiving or participating in certain forms of public assistance/benefits/programs, or are a veteran, you may qualify to have the application fee waived. REQUIRED INFORMATION:

- 1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
- 2. **Education and Experience Exam:** Fill out all the required sections displayed onscreen (if applicable). You will have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it in the Online Application System (OASys).

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

THE TEST:

Your score will be determined by an Education and Experience Exam. You will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the eligibility and license/certificate requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

Experience used to gain additional credit must be obtained by the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025).

If you have satisfactory full-time experience working for the City of New York as a permanent (non-provisional) employee, for any governmental entity other than the City of New York, or for any private employer operating a high pressure boiler while in possession of a valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Department of Buildings, a valid Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating System Operating Engineer (Q-01/Q-99) issued by the New York City Fire Department and a valid Universal Section 608 Technician Certification issued by a certifying organization approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, for:

You will receive up to:

At least 1 year but less than 2 years 6 points

At least 2 years but less than 3 years 12 points

At least 3 years but less than 4 years 18 points

At least 4 years but less than 5 years 24 points

5 or more years 30 points

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you may answer questions about your experience. If your experience was on a part-time basis working less than 35 hours per week, you will need to convert your part-time experience to full-time experience using the formula below. Once you have determined your full-time experience equivalent, use this amount to answer questions about your experience.

(number of hours worked per week/35) x (number of months worked)

For example, if you worked at a job for 21 hours per week for 12 months, you would make the following calculation: $21/35 \times 12 = 7.2$ months.

You will receive a maximum of one year of experience credit for each year you worked.

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys). Once you Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys, you will not be permitted to submit new or additional information online.

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

THE TEST RESULTS:

If you pass the Education and Experience Exam and are marked eligible, your name will be placed in final score order on a CUNY eligible list, you will be given a list number, and you will be notified by email of your test results. The eligible list determines the order by which candidates will be considered for promotion. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for promotion when your name is reached on the CUNY eligible list.

If you believe that your test part was rated incorrectly, you may submit an appeal of your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, through the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must give specific reasons why your score should be higher. Your appeal may result in a higher or lower rating.

To access the appeal portal of OASys, please log into your OASys account at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs and use the following steps:

- 1. Navigate to the Dashboard for the Appeals tab.
- 2. Click the NEW APPEAL button to create and submit your appeal.
- 3. Select the exam from the Exam drop-down list, and
- 4. Select the exam part from the Exam Part drop-down list.
- 5. Select the reason for your appeal from the Appeal Reason drop-down list (if applicable).
- 6. Enter the details of your appeal by providing specific reasons why your score should be higher.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Appointment of New York City Civil Service Employees: Please note that City University of New York (CUNY) is a separate municipal employer; therefore, employees of New York City agencies cannot transfer to CUNY. If an employee of a New York City agency accepts a position with CUNY, the employee's date of appointment for the purposes of salary, seniority, and time and leave accruals is his/her date of appointment to CUNY.

Selective Certification for Certifications:

If you have certifications in one or more of the areas listed below, you may be considered for promotion to positions requiring these certifications through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring these certifications. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, follow the onscreen instructions when completing the Education and Experience Exam to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification and Final Submit it in the Online Application System (OASys). Your certifications and credentials will be checked by CUNY at the time of promotion. If you are promoted through Selective Certification, the certificate must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

- 1. Certificate of Fitness for Citywide Standpipe Systems (S-13) issued by the New York City Fire **Department (SSA):** Possession of a Certificate of Fitness for Supervision of Standpipe System (Citywide) issued by the New York City Fire Department.
- Certificate of Fitness for Citywide Sprinkler Systems (S-12) issued by the New York City Fire Department (ASC): Possession of a Certificate of Fitness for Supervision of Sprinkler Systems (Citywide) issued by the New York City Fire Department.
- Certificate of Fitness for Supervision of Fire Alarm Systems (S-95) issued by the New York City Fire Department (FAS): Possession of a Certificate of Fitness for Supervision of Fire Alarm Systems issued by the New York City Fire Department.
 Selective Certification for positions requiring a Qualified Swimming Pool Water Treatment Operator's Certificate issued by a New York State Department of Health approved course provider (POC): Possession of a Qualified Swimming Pool Water Treatment Operator's Certificate issued by a New York State Department of Health approved course provider. issued by a New York State Department of Health approved course provider.

Please include the examination title and number, your full name, OASys Profile ID number, and the Selective Certification(s) you are requesting in your submission.

List Termination:

The eligible list resulting from this examination will be terminated one year from the date it is established, unless extended by CUNY.

Application Receipt:

You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, check "Junk", "Trash", or "Spam" folders for the primary email linked to your Online Application System (OASys) account. If you are unable to locate the email, you can view a summary of the notification email to you on your OASys Dashboard, then Notifications. If you are still unable to find the email, please email DCAS via the Contact feature available in OASys with a description of the issue and include the exam number and your profile number located on your Profile page. While on your Profile page, check that the email addresses you provided are correct and/or updated. This promotion examination is for CUNY only and not for City agencies or the NYC Health + Hospitals. If you would like to apply for the promotion examination for Stationary Engineer for City agencies, you must submit a separate application and fee for Exam No. 6549 from August 6, 2025 through August 26, 2025. If you would like to apply for the promotion examination for Stationary Engineer (NYC Health + Hospitals), you must submit a separate application and fee for Exam No. 6548 from August 6, 2025 through August 26, 2025.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION:

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after promotion, and may result in criminal prosecution.
